A Sunflower Cottage Crochet Pattern

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Pattern Specifics:

Materials:

- Any 3 weight yarn of your choosing – I used Wendy Supreme DK in color WD27 Eucalyptus
- 5mm (H) hook
- Scissors
- Tapestry Needle
- Stitch Markers optional to mark the first or last stitch of the row.
- Measuring Tape optional.

Gauge:

Does not matter as long as tension is consistent. My gauge was 20 sts and 18 rows of main body per 4”.

Gauge Swatch:

Row 1: Ch 30, sc in second ch from hook and each ch across (28)

Row 2: Turn, Ch1 (does not count), sc in first st, *[sc, ch1, dc] in next st, sk2* Rep from * to * until you have 1 st left, sc in last st.

Row 3: Turn, ch1 (does not count), sc in first st, work [sc, ch1, dc] into each ch1 sp across. SC in final st.

Rows 4-25: Repeat row 3.

Abbreviations used:

- Ch(s) - chain(s)
- St(s) - stitch(es)

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- Fsc – foundation single crochet
 - sc- single crochet
 - dc - double crochet
 - ss - slip stitch
 - Sp(s) – space(s)
 - YO - yarn over
 - FO - Fasten off
 - [] Everything in these brackets are worked into the same ch1 sp

Pattern Notes:

- Written in US terms
- Chain 1 **does not** count as a stitch unless stated otherwise.
- Where the counts differ for each size within the pattern sizing will be indicated as lovey (security, preemie. baby, receiving, toddler)(swaddle, crib, throw, double, queen, king)
- The stitch multiple for this one is 3 for a chain start (multiples of 3 +2 for a foundation sc start)

Special stitches:

I find this has a more aesthetically pleasing finish than the chain starts to projects and it gives the project more movement.



Oliver Blanket Pattern:

Row 1: Ch30 (42, 66, 90, 120, 126)(141, 135, 156, 270, 288, 324) sc in second ch from hook and each ch across (29 (41, 65, 89, 119, 125)(140, 134, 155, 269, 287, 323) sts)

OR foundation sc 29 (41, 65, 89, 119, 125)(140, 134, 155, 269, 287, 323)

Row 2: Turn, Ch1 (does not count), sc in first st, *[sc, ch1, dc] in next st, sk2* Rep from * to * until you have 1 st left, sc in last st.

Row 3: Turn, ch1 (does not count), sc in first st, work [sc, ch1, dc] into each ch1 sp across. SC in final st.

Rows 4-onward: Repeat row 3 until your blanket measures 9 (16, 21, 34, 39, 51)(46, 59, 59, 107, 107, 107)" tall

Row 5: Turn, ch1 (does not count), sc in each st and ch1 sp across. (29 (41, 65, 89, 119, 125)(140, 134, 155, 269, 287, 323) sts)

Adding the border:

Note: this border technically has a right side and wrong side – but both sides look great!

Round 1: Turn, ch1, sc in each st across, [sc, ch2, sc] in corner st, sc into each row down the blanket, [sc, ch2, sc] in corner st, sc in each st across the bottom of your blanket, [sc, ch2, sc] in corner st, sc into each row up your blanket, [sc, ch2] in final corner st, ss to first sc to join.

Round 2: Decide which side is the back of this blanket. Have that side facing you.
Ch1, [dc, ss] in first ch2 sp, *dc in next st, ss into next st* across around ensuring that you place a [dc, ss] **or a** [ss, dc] into each ch2 sp for the corners. Note: it does not matter whether you start your corner with a dc or ss! SS to top of first dc to join.

FO and weave in ends.
