Pattern Specifics:

Materials:

Any 3 weight yarn of your choosing – I used Stylecraft Special DK from my scrap bucket.

- 4mm (G) hook
- Scissors
- Tapestry Needle
- Stitch Markers optional to mark first or last stitch of the row.
- Measuring Tape

Gauge:

Does not matter as long as tension is consistent. This pattern is designed to work with your gauge and tension

Sizing:

This pattern is written for several preemie sizes:

Size	Crown Width	Hat Length	Approx. Yardage
Up to 2 lbs	3"	3.75"	40

2-3 lbs	3.25"	4"	45
3-5 lbs	3.5"	4.25"	50
6-8 lbs	3.75"	4.5"	60

Abbreviations used:

- Ch(s) - chain(s)
- St(s) - stitch(es)
- MR – magic ring
- sc- single crochet
- dc - double crochet
- ss - slip stitch
- Sp(s) – space(s)
- YO - yarn over
- FO - Fasten off
- [] Everything in these brackets is worked into the same ch1 sp or st
- () denotes the difference in instructions per size (see notes) **or** the stitch counts at the end of the round.



Pattern Notes:

- Written in US terms
- Chain 1 **does not** count as a stitch unless stated otherwise.
- Where the counts differ for each size within the pattern sizing will be indicated as 2lbs (2-3 lbs, 3-5 lbs, 6-8 lbs)
- The stitch multiple for this pattern is 3 as it is worked in the round, top down.
- We will work the crown first. It is more important that your measurements are correct rather than which round you work up to. Measuring the diameter of your crown (end to end through the middle) is important.
- The crown widths are provided according to my gauge from round 2 onwards. These are the diameter measurements. If you cannot / do not meet gauge when working the crown of your hat, take a note of the size it should be from the chart above and stop when you reach the correct size - the pattern will still work for you!
- The scalloped edging around the brim is optional.

Special stitches:

Oliver Premie Beanie Pattern:

To work the crown:

Round 1: In MR, hdc 9. SS to first hdc to join. (9)

OR CH3, ss to first ch to join (creates a ring), Ch1, in the center of the ring hdc 9.
SS to top of first hdc to join. (9)

Round 2: Ch1, work 2 hdc in each st around. SS to top of first hdc to join. (18)

Your crown should now measure 1.25" (see pattern notes above).



Round 3: Ch1, hdc in first st, 2 hdc in next st, *hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st. Rep from * 7 more times. SS to top of first hdc to join. (27)

Your crown should now measure 1.75".

Round 4: Ch1, hdc in first 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, *hdc in next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st. Rep from * 7 more times. SS to top of first hdc to join. (36)

Your crown should now measure 2.25".

Round 5: Ch1, hdc in first 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st, *hdc in next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st. Rep from * 7 more times. SS to top of first hdc to join. (45)

Your crown should now measure 2.75".

Round 6 :

For size 1-2lbs only: Ch1, sc in first 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, *sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st. Rep from * 7 more times. Sc in the last 2 sts. SS to top of first hdc to join. (54)

For size 1-2 lbs move to the main body of the hat.

Your crown should now measure 3 "

All other sizes: Ch1, hdc in first 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, *hdc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st. Rep from * 7 more times. Hdc in the last 2 sts. SS to top of first hdc to join. (54)

For size 2-3 lbs move to the main body of the hat.

Your crown should now measure 3.25".

Round 7: Ch1, hdc in first 5 sts, 2 hdc in next st, *hdc in next 5 sts, 2 hdc in next st. Rep from * 7 more times. SS to top of first hdc to join. (63)

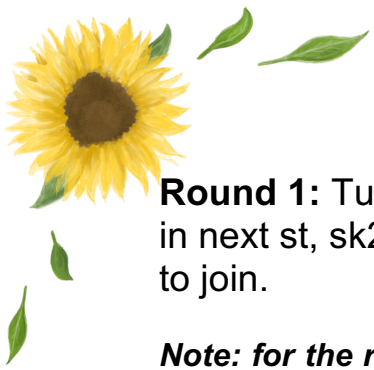
For Size 3-5 lbs move to round 9.

Your crown should now measure 3.5".

Round 8: Ch1, sc in first 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, *sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st. Rep from * 7 more times. Sc in the last 3 sts. SS to top of first sc to join. (72)

Your crown should now measure 3.75".

To work the main body of the hat:



Round 1: Turn, Ch1 (does not count), *[sc, ch1, dc] in next st, sk2* Rep from * to * around. SS to first sc to join.

Note: *for the rest of the main body of the hat we will only be working into the ch1 sps.*

Round 2: Turn, ss into first ch1 sp, Ch1 (does not count),* [sc, ch1, dc] in next ch1 sp,* Rep from * to * around. SS to first sc to join.

Rounds 3 – 9 (10, 11, 12): Rep round 2 (remembering to turn on every round) until your hat is the following height (measured from the top of the crown down to the edge of the hat) based on the edging you are working:

Straight edge – 3.75 (4, 4.25, 4.5)” tall

Scalloped edge – 3.25, (3.5, 3.75, 4)” tall

Do not FO.

Adding the border:

Note: *this border technically has a right side and wrong side – but both sides look great!*

Round 1: Turn, ch1, sc in each st & ch1 space around. SS to first st to join.

If you are working a straight edge FO and weave in ends.

For the scalloped edge move to round 2.

Round 2: With right side facing you, Ch1 (doesn't count), dc in first st, ss into next st, *dc in next st, ss into next st* around. SS to first dc to join.

FO and weave in ends.
