- Enough scrap yarn to make a scarf it looks great using scraps of different colours!
- 5mm
- Stitch markers (optional)
- Scissors
- Tapestry needle

Gauge

Not important for this project as you are using your scraps

Sízíng

My scarf was approximately 8" wide by 40" long

Abbreviations

- Ch(s)--chain(s)
- St(s)--stitch(es)
- rep--repeat
- sk—skip
- fsc foundation single crochet
- hdc—half double crochet
- sc single crochet
- sc2tog single crochet 2 together
- N St N stitch (see special stitches)
- Blo back loop only
- YO—yarn over
- FO—fasten off
- [] everything noted between these is worked into the same st

Pattern Notes

- Written in US terms.
- Ch1 stitches at the beginning do count as a st unless otherwise stated
- The stitch count is in parenthesis at the end of each row.
- Note the first and last row of each colour block is a sc row. This gives the blocks a cleaner, crisper edge

The grit stitch is worked over two stitches. It consists of *[sc, dc] in the first st, sk the next st* repeat from * to *.



Pattern:

Row 1 - Fsc 25 OR CH 26, sc in second ch from hook and each ch across (25)

- Row 2 Turn, ch1, dc in the first st, *sk the next st [sc, dc] in the next st* Rep from * to * until you have 2 sts left, sk 1 st, sc in the last st.
- **Row 3** Rep row 2 until you have approximately 18 inches of your scrap yarn left after completing a full row.
- Row 4 Turn, ch1 (does not count as a st), sc in each st across.
- Row 5 Grab your next part skein of yarn
 Attach your yarn to your work (in the last st you just made)
 Repeat row 4



Row 7 - Repeat row 4

Row 8 - Repeat rows 5 - 7 until your scarf is as long as desired!

FO and Sew in ends.
