



# **Sunflower Wall Hanging**

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A Sunflower Cottage Crochet Pattern

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# **Pattern Specifics:**

### Materials:

#4 weight yarn of your choosing - In 4 colours

- 5mm and 4mm hook
- Scissors
- · Tapestry needle
- Stitch Markers optional to mark first or last stitch of the row.

**Gauge:** Does not matter as long as tension is consistent.

**Sizing:** Your wall hanging size will vary depending on the stitch you use. I used mini corner to corner and my wall hanging is approximately 15" wide by 19.5" tall

Note: this pattern is written so that you can make it any size with a variety of techniques and use whatever size yarn and appropriate hook takes your fancy! I have given written and colour block instructions for corner to corner but you have the chart to work from for a different technique (intarsia, tapestry, single crochets. Equally, you can choose to use either double crochet or half double crochet for your corner to corner section.

## **Abbreviations used:**

- Ch(s) chain(s)
- St(s) stitch(es)
- YO yarn over
- Sc single crochet
- $\circ$  hdc half double crochet
- SDCP staggered double crochet pairs
- SS slip stitch
- FO fasten off

## **Pattern Notes:**

Written in US terms.

Ch stitches at the beginning **do not** count as a st unless otherwise stated.

The stitch multiple is 2 for the bottom edging

- Pattern is written for #4 weight yarn but you can play around with your yarn and hooks to get any size you need for this one!
- The first part of this pattern is for the corner to corner pattern. You will find the written instructions for this first. The colour block instructions and chart are the end of the pattern if you prefer these. If you are new to corner to corner I have a Learn to Corner to Corner Mini Course at

https://sunflowercottagecrochet.com/learn-to-corner-tocorner/ When working Part 1 (the corner to corner section) the arrows indicate which way the row is worked according to the graph – left to right or right to left (this is the same with the arrows in the color block instructions!)

Part 1 is a corner to corner graph and is worked bottom right to top left on the right side.

To work out how much yarn you will need you will need to do a sample swatch with the stitch you intend to use (HDC or DC) and then measure how much yarn you used per stitch multiplying that by the number of stitches of that color and adding some for the tails to be worked in at the end. Stitch totals for part 1 are:

Colour	No of Sts
White	282
Yellow	173
Orange	109
Brown	61

## **Special stitches:**

**DC2TOG:** Also known as a decrease, YO, insert hook into indicated stitch and pull up a loop, YO and pull thru 2 loops only, YO, insert hook into next st and pull up a loop, YO and pull thru all remaining loops on the hook.

### **SDCP:** \*This is the same as the DC2Tog stitch but you only

work into the CH1 spaces from row 2.

Double crocheting 2 together by placing first leg of the decrease in the previous stitch worked and second leg of the stitch in the next ch1 space and chain 1 are what make the Staggered Double Crochet Pairs stitch. The video linked above helps to explain how to do it very well and I chose to include the full instructions in the pattern for clarification as well. 

## Sunflower Wall Hanging Pattern:

## Part 1:

Note: The graph and colour block instructions for this part are at the end of this pattern on pages 11 and 12.

∠ Row 1: (white) x 1 (1 square)
↗ Row 2: (white) x 2 (2 squares)
∠ Row 3: (white) x 3 (3 squares)
↗ Row 4: (white) x 4 (4 squares)
∠ Row 5: (white) x 5 (5 squares)
↗ Row 6: (white) x 6 (6 squares)
∠ Row 7: (white) x 7 (7 squares)
↗ Row 8: (white) x 8 (8 squares)
∠ Row 9: (white) x 4, (yellow) x 1, (white) x 4 (9 squares)

**Row 10**: (white) x 2, (orange) x 1, (white) x 1, (yellow) x
2, (white) x 1, (orange) x 1, (white) x 2 (10 squares)

∠ Row 11: (white) x 2, (orange) x 1, (white) x 2, (yellow) x 1, (white) x 2, (orange) x 1, (white) x 2 (11 squares)

**Row 12**: (white) x 3, (orange) x 1, (white) x 1, (yellow) x
2, (white) x 1, (orange) x 1, (white) x 3 (12 squares)

✓ Row 13: (white) x 3, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 2, (white) x 3 (13 squares)

**Row 14**: (white) x 1, (yellow) x 2, (white) x 1, (orange) x
2, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 2, (white) x 1, (yellow) x 2, (white) x 1 (14 squares)

✓ Row 15: (white) x 2, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 2, (white) x 2 (15 squares)

✓ Row 17: (white) x 3, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 1, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 1, (yellow) x 3, (white) x 3 (17 squares)

**Row 18**: (white) x 4, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 1, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 1, (yellow) x 3, (white) x 1, (orange) x 1, (white) x 2 (18 squares)

✓ Row 19: (white) x 2, (orange) x 3, (yellow) x 4, (brown) x 1, (yellow) x 4, (orange) x 3, (white) x 2 (19 squares)

**Row 20**: (white) x 2, (orange) x 4, (yellow) x 2, (brown) x 4, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 4, (white) x 2 (20 squares)

**Row 21**: (white) x 4, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 2, (brown) x 5, (yellow) x 1, (orange) x 3, (white) x 4 (21 squares)

**Row 22**: (white) x 5, (orange) x 3, (brown) x 6, (yellow) x 1, (orange) x 2, (white) x 5 (22 squares)

∠ Row 23: (white) x 5, (yellow) x 4, (brown) x 5, (yellow) x 4, (white) x 5 (23 squares)

**Row 24**: (white) x 4, (yellow) x 5, (brown) x 6, (yellow) x 5, (white) x 4 (24 squares)

✓ Row 25: (white) x 4, (yellow) x 5, (brown) x 7, (yellow) x 5, (white) x 4 (25 squares)

#### Corner from both sides

**Row 26:** (white) x 4, (yellow) x 5, (brown) x 6, (yellow) x 5, (white) x 4 (24 squares)

✓ Row 27: (white) x 5, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 1, (yellow) x 1, (brown) x 5, (yellow) x 4, (white) x 5 (23 squares)

**Row 28:** (white) x 5, (orange) x 3, (brown) x 6, (yellow) x 1, (orange) x 3, (white) x 4 (22 squares)

✓ Row 29: (white) x 2, (orange) x 4, (yellow) x 2, (brown) x 5, (yellow) x 1, (orange) x 3, (white) x 4 (21 squares)

Row 30: (white) x 2, (orange) x 4, (yellow) x 2, (brown) x 4, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 4, (white) x 2 (20 squares)
 Row 31: (white) x 2, (orange) x 3, (yellow) x 4, (brown) x 1, (yellow) x 4, (orange) x 3, (white) x 2 (19 squares)

**Row 32**: (white) x 2, (orange) x 1, (white) x 1, (yellow) x 6, (orange) x 1, (yellow) x 3, (white) x 4 (18 squares)

∠ Row 33: (white) x 3, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 1, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 1, (yellow) x 3, (white) x 3 (17 squares)

**Row 34**: (white) x 2, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 3, (white) x 2 (16 squares)

✓ Row 35: (white) x 2, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 2, (white) x 2 (15 squares)

**Row 36**: (white) x 1, (yellow) x 2, (white) x 1, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 2, (orange) x 3, (yellow) x 2, (white) x 1 (14 squares)

✓ Row 37: (white) x 3, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 3, (orange) x 2, (white) x 3 (13 squares)



**Row 38**: (white) x 3, (orange) x 2, (yellow) x 2, (white) x 1, (orange) x 2, (white) x 2 (12 squares)

∠ Row 39: (white) x 2, (orange) x 1, (white) x 2, (yellow) x 1, (white) x 1, (orange) x 2, (white) x 2 (11 squares)

**Row 40**: (white) x 2, (orange) x 1, (white) x 1, (yellow) x
2, (white) x 2, (orange) x 1, (white) x 1 (10 squares)

∠ Row 41: (white) x 4, (yellow) x 1, (white) x 1, (orange) x 1, (white) x 2 (9 squares)

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    ✓ Row 42: (white) x 8 (8 squares)
    ∠ Row 43: (white) x 7 (7 squares)
    ✓ Row 44: (white) x 6 (6 squares)
    ∠ Row 45: (white) x 5 (5 squares)
    ✓ Row 46: (white) x 4 (4 squares)
    ∠ Row 47: (white) x 3 (3 squares)
    ✓ Row 48: (white) x 2 (2 squares)
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∠ Row 49: (white) x 1 (1 square)

### The Preparation:


vour c2c blocks

**If you worked a HDC c2c block:** With this part you are going to be SC into the spaces between the C2C blocks and chaining 2.

If you worked a DC c2c block: You will substitute each CH2 for a CH3.

# **Preparing your Squares**



SC between the next 2 blocks





### Part 2: The Striped bottom section

Now we will be working the coloured rows of SDCP sts under our sunflower.

Note: You will now be working in rows to add height to your wall hanging. You may add as many rows as you wish and in any colour combination.

Attach your white yarn to any corner. With a 4mm hook ....

Note: for this section refer to the figure photos under the special stitches.

**Row 1:** SC an even number of stitch along one side of your sunflower.

**Row 2: In Brown** CH3 (counts as a dc, ch1), \*DC2Tog across next 2 sts, Ch1. \* Rep from \* to \* across, dc in last st.

**Row 3: In white** Ch3, turn, DC2Tog across 1st and 2nd Ch1 spaces, Ch1, \*DC2Tog by inserting your hook into the same stitch as the last leg of the previous stitch you just did and the next Ch1 space, Ch1\* Rep from \* to \*

ensuring that you place the last leg of the final stitch under the ch3 from previous row, DC in top of ch3.

Row 3: In yellow, Rep row 3

Row 4: In white, Rep row 3

Row 5: In orange, Rep row 3

Row 6: In white, Rep row 3

Row 7: In yellow, Rep row 3

Row 8: In white, Rep row 3

Row 9: In brown, Rep row 3

Row 10: In white, Rep row 3

Do not FO.

#### Edging your wall hanging:

In white, Ch1, turn, Sc in first st and each st across the bottom of your wall hanging until you have 1 st remaining, [2sc, ch1, 2sc] in last st.

Turn your work so you are working up the side of your wall hanging, Sc evenly (for me this was 2 sts in each ch2 sp) up the side of your wall hanging until you have 1 st remaining, [2sc, ch1, 2sc] in last st.

Turn your work so that you are working along the top of your project,, Sc in second st and each st across the top of your wall hanging until you have 1 st remaining, [2sc, ch1, 2sc] in last st.

Turn your work so you are working down the side of your wall hanging, Sc evenly (for me this was 2 sts in each ch2 sp) down the side of your wall hanging until you have 1 st remaining, [2sc, ch1, sc] in last st. SS to top of first sc to join.

FO and weave in ends.

I would recommend that you block your wall hanging if required at this point, before attaching the dowl.

Attaching your dowl:

There are 2 options here.

**Option 1**:

Chain 65, skip all of the stitches in the row and slip stitch to the last stitch of the row


OR

#### Option 2:


Single crochet over a length of 6mm dowl cut to approx. 2" longer than your wall hanging. I have video tutorials on how to do this Right handed video tutorial -<u>https://youtu.be/UWNahHENBUM</u> Left handed video tutorial -<u>https://youtu.be/5JkVmqt8E60</u>


FO ad weave in ends.
