



Misty Days Blanket

A Sunflower Cottage Crochet Pattern

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Pattern Specifics:

Materials:

- #4 worsted weight cotton (see sizing below)
- 5mm hook
- Stitch markers (optional)
- Scissors
- Tapestry needle

Gauge:

16 sts and 18 rows of main body in 4"

Gauge Swatch: Ch35,

Row 1: Ss into second ch from hook, *hdc into next

st, ss into next st,*Rep from * to * across.

Row 2: Turn, ch1, hdc into first st, *ss into next st,

hdc into next* st. Rep from * to * across

Row 3: Turn, ch1, ss into first st, *hdc into next st, ss

into next st,*Rep from * to * across.

Rows 4-30: rep rows 2 and 3.

Sizing: This pattern is written for 9 sizes.

Abbreviations used:

CH(s) - chain(s)

St(s) - stitch(es)

Rep - repeat

SS - slip stitch



SC – single crochet

HDC -half double crochet

DC - Double Crochet

SS - slip stitch

YO - yarn over

FO - fasten off

Pattern Notes:

- Written in US Terms
- CH1 stitches at the beginning of each row do not count as a st unless otherwise stated.
- The stitch count remains the same for each row. They are given at the end of row 1 as each round maintains the same stitch count.
- Where pattern is different per size this will be shown as Preemie (Security, Baby, Receiving, Crib)(Throw, Double, Queen, King)
- Please read the pattern and ensure you are comfortable with it before starting your project.
- For the baby sizes the edging is written to only be placed around 3 of the sides. This is to ensure that the gaps of the edging are out of the way of baby's fingers.

Special stitches:

There are no special stitches in this pattern.

Misty Days Blanket Pattern:

Main body of the blanket:

Row 1: CH 72 (42, 96, 130, 140)(170, 314, 330, 368). Ss into second ch from hook, *hdc into next st, ss into next st,*Rep from * to * across. (71 (41, 95, 129, 139)(169, 313, 329, 367) sts)

Row 2: Turn, ch1, hdc into first st, *ss into next st, hdc into next st* Rep from * to * across.

Row 3: Turn, ch1, ss into first st, *hdc into next st, ss into next st,* Rep from * to * across.

Rows 4-onward: Rep rows 2 and 3 until the main body of your blanket is approximately 19.5 (15, 32, 36, 55)(50, 96, 94, 92)" tall.

Edging around your blanket:

For All Baby Sizes or to work a 3 sided edge on a larger blanket:

Round 1:

Note: for this round you will want to ensure that you have an odd number of stitches between each ch1

space. I recommend marking the ch1 sps with a stitch marker.

Step 1: Ch1, Sc in first st and each st across the top of your blanket until you reach the last st. [Sc, ch 1, sc] in last st.

Step 2: Turn your blanket 90 degrees so that you are working down the side and •sc evenly down the side of your blanket until you reach the last st of the side. [Sc, ch 1, sc] in last st.*

Step 3: Turn your blanket another 90 degrees so that you are working along the bottom edge and repeat from * to *.

Step 4: Turn your blanket 90 degrees so that you are working up the last side and sc evenly up the side. In the last st work a sc.

Round 2: Turn, Ch1, dc in first st, *ch1, sk 1, dc in the next st*, Rep from * to * until you reach the last st before the ch1 sp, dc in last st. [Dc, ch1, dc] in the Ch1 sp, dc in next st, Rep from * to *again until you reach the last st before the ch1 sp, dc in last st. [Dc, ch1, dc] in the Ch1 sp, dc in next st. Rep from * to * once more. You should end with a dc in the st before the last ch1 sp.

Round 3: Turn, ch1, *sc in each st and ch1 sp until you reach the ch1 sp at the corner. [sc, ch1, sc] in the corner ch1 sp*. Turn your blanket 90 degrees.

Rep from * to * once more. Turn your blanket 90 degrees and work a sc in each st and ch1 sp across the third side of your blanket until you reach the final dc of this side.

Rep rows 2 and 3 until your border is 2.5 (2, 3, 4, 5) (5, 6, 7, 8)" wide.

Note: end with a row 3 - you may want to sc across the top of your blanket on the final round just to give the top a nice straight edge.

FO and weave in ends.

For a continuous border on the larger blankets:

Round 1:

Note: for this round you will want to ensure that you have an odd number number of stitches between each ch1 space. I recommend marking the ch1 sps with a stitch marker.

Ch1, Sc in first st and each st across the top of your blanket until you reach the last st. [Sc, ch 1, sc] in last st to create the corner.

Turn your blanket 90 degrees so that you are working down the side and •sc evenly along the side of your blanket until you reach the last st of the side. [Sc, ch 1, sc] in last st. Turn your blanket another 90

degrees so that you are working along the next side and repeat from * all of the way around your blanket until you have 1 st remaining. In the last st work a [sc, ch1] and ss to the first st to join.

Round 2: Turn, ss into the closest ch1 sp. Ch1, dc in first ch1 sp, dc in next st, *ch1, sk 1, dc in the next st, Rep from * to * until you reach the last st before the ch1 corner sp, dc in last st**. [Dc, ch1, dc] in the Ch1 sp, dc in next st, Rep from * around until you reach your last ch1 sp of the round (which will be just after **) [Dc, ch1] in the Ch1 sp, SS to the top of the first st to join.

Round 3: Turn, ss into the stitch after the closest ch1 sp, ch1(does not count as a st), *sc in each st and ch1 sp until you reach the ch1 sp at the corner. [sc, ch1, sc] in the corner ch1 sp. Turn your blanket 90 degrees. Rep from * twice more. Turn your blanket 90 degrees and work a sc in each st and ch1 sp across the last side of your blanket until you reach the final dc of this side, [sc, ch1] in the last st and ss to the top of the first sc to join.

Rep rows 2 and 3 until your border is 2.5 (2, 3, 4, 5) (5, 6, 7, 8)" wide.

FO and weave in ends.
